New Jersey Statutes Title 18A:37-2. Causes for Suspension or Expulsion of Pupils (To include but not limited to...)

- Continued and willful disobedience;
- Open defiance of the authority of any teacher or person having authority over him;
- Conduct of such character as to constitute a continuing danger to the physical well-being of other pupils;
- Physical assault on another pupil;
- Taking or attempting to take, personal property from another pupil or from his presence by means of force or fear;
- Willfully causing or attempting to cause substantial damage to school property;
- Incitement which is intended to and does result in truancy by other pupils;
- Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or controlled dangerous substances on school premises, or being under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled dangerous substances while on school premises;
- Assault upon teacher, administrator, board member or other employees constitutes immediate suspension;
- Assault (see above) involving a weapon constitutes immediate removal from the school pending a hearing before the Board of Education.

Current Practices, New Initiatives and Challenges Montclair Public Schools

Overview of Current Practices

- Additional layer of administrative scrutiny before suspension/search for alternative
- Groups with SAC counselors/social workers for conflict management/resolution techniques
- Student advisories in the middle schools daily, weekly & extended home room schedules
- Teacher team meetings to discuss best practices, and discuss behavioral strategies
- Student assemblies, "town meetings," principal and interactive meetings (gender, grade, topic and school)
- Student government/councils, ambassadors
- Peer leadership (i.e. 8th grade peer mentors identified at the end of 7th grade)
- Assemblies with outside speakers
- Reviewing and revising the schools' and district's codes of conduct
- Staff meetings/professional development to review behavioral management, pre-interventions, and professional development for staff
- MAP program (Center for Achievement)
- All schools engage in some element of Positive Behavioral Support in Schools (PBSIS)
- Academy at Glenfield
- MNDC Project Oasis

Some New and Promising Initiatives

- Expansion of Academy at Glenfield
- Restorative Justice Model for increased student voice
- Expansion of AVID tools and strategies
- Inclusion for climate/culture component of SATp
- Improvement of ISS support
- Expansion of Center for Achievement (CFA) to general education

Challenges

- Time constraints organizing using teams
- Methods of diffusing conflicts
- Behavior management strategies and turn-key training for staff
- Staffing needs
- Working with parents and families on critical topics
- In school suspension (ISS) funding
- Modifications to the code of conduct
- Funding and time for next phase of Undoing Racism
- Training for teachers/staff regarding various student behavioral expressions
- Funding for alternative programs
- Balancing support to staff/teachers with appropriate support for students
