ACTION ITEMS:

- Develop PD opportunities on social problem solving conflict resolution/character education curriculum/programs
- Implement a district wide Restorative Justice model
- Review and update/revise the district wide Student Discipline/Code of Conduct (P5600) for elementary, middle and high school alignment
- Work with community partners (i.e. MNDC, IMANI) on coordinating and developing programs for our students
- Analyze data (i.e. OCR) to determine trends/commonalities, and provide training/in-service/PD for staff, and develop individual educational plans for students
- Engage parents in School Action Team for Partnership (SATp) meetings, and parent education opportunities

V & V CONVERSION TO SSDS

- Effective September 2017 the State changed its reporting system and process. The Violence and Vandalism (V&V) reporting has been changed to the School Safety Data System (SSDS)
- The changes in the process include numerous categories that have been deleted from the report, and new categories, not previously reported. Some categories have been combined and some renamed, along with different criteria for reporting.
- Effective January 2018, the new system is now open to school districts for the input of data.
